12/18/19 Atlantic CAC meeting minutes

Neighborhoods present: Pinecrest, Brentwood, Greenwood

Police update: the same call total from last month to this month. Mambo is under new ownership and is open with a new ABC permit. There is no suspect in the homicide that took place there. The city is working with the club on issues. Two of the cars stolen in the last month had been running and been left unlocked. Incidents of vandalism were up from last month. Police are working on ways to get Brentwood Park's gate closed at night to deter vehicle traffic in the park. There were 9 car break ins from unlocked cars; 12 total – down from last month. There were 4 reports of shots fired but 3 were unfounded. Police offer the following tips on preventing porch piracy and other crime: Have packages delivered to the back door or ask a neighbor to watch for it; break down boxes; keep on the look out for mail theft

Code Enforcement update: city staff check on the Capitol Plaza hotel fencing every week. A question was asked about leaves left in the street and Jason clarified the Transportation Services division deals with leaves.

Parks & Rec update: There is a new playground at Spring Forest Park. The City is hiring for summer camps. January 28th Green Road Community Center will host a public meeting on the Brentwood Sewer Project from 6-7:30pm.

Community Engagement: The city offers the Citizens Leadership Academy, a 10-week course on strengthening neighborhoods. Applications are now being accepted for the Spring 2020 class. Dan introduced Andrea from the Department of Transportation-Transit, who is available to share information about public transportation services.

Councilmember Cox: The city will develop a process for neighborhoods to request special consideration for leaf collection because neighborhoods have not been treated equally in the past. Cox discussed potential upcoming bonds that may be put forth to voters, including bonds for parks & greenways city-wide, for Dix Park, and for affordable housing. Cox stressed the importance of getting feedback from residents about needs and priorities. The Council is also discussing regulatory changes regarding zoning and Neighborhood Conservation Overlay Districts (NCOD). The Capitol Plaza Hotel rezoning case will come to Council for its first meeting in late January or early February.

Chair Jetton discussed the CAC budget and her desire to create a logo for the CAC. It was suggested a youth competition could be done to pick a logo.

Meeting adjourned at 8:30pm.
