- Code Enforcement Division
 - David Johnson gave information about the Code Enforcement Division.
 - Currently they are focused on keeping curbs and gutters clean.
 - For loose leaf collection questions, go on city website and enter your address.
- Community Engagement
 - Shared information on the Citizen's Leadership Academy starting in March.

III. Census (Not on original agenda)

- They are in need more workers. About 2,600 people needed in Wake County.
- Must be 18. The pay is \$19.00 per hr. and mileage is \$0.58 per mile.
- Temporary employment with Census does not impact SNAP benefits.
- People can respond by phone, mail or online.
- Each time there is a missed person over \$1,600 is lost for the City of Raleigh.

IV. Parks, Recreation and Cultural Resources Department Gary Clayborn

- Fisher Street Park Update
 - He shared information about relocating the park to the corner of Fisher and Pender.
 - The features of current park are to be relocated:
 - Basketball Court
 - Playground
 - Picnic Table
 - Housing and Neighborhood Department will be providing funding.
 - Currently looking at possible playground equipment.

- Hopefully by summer they will get approval and start construction by 2021.
- He has paper copies of the survey available.
- Carver Park/Pender St. Park/John Stokes Memorial Garden Park Update
 - Chair asked about John Stokes and Gary mentioned a way to connect the sites.
 - Resident question about survey questions pertaining to park usage. Gary responded that the survey is very general.
 - Chair shared that she thought there should have been a history shared about the Fisher St. park in the survey.
 - Chair shared that she was excited about the addition.
 - Resident asked about the before pictures of the park when it was built in 1969.
 - Resident asked if this was the park that was about to be renamed.
 - Shawsheen Baker (PRCR) elaborated about Lane St. Park being renamed to the LeVelle Moton Park. There will be a ceremony for the renaming.
 - History on Levelle – He grew up in Idlewild and is currently the NCCU Head Basketball Coach.
 - Resident question asked about updates to Lane St. Shawsheen informed that the park will not change but the name will.
- Chair asked about steps moving forward? Gary responded that they will be returning in February for a brief update.
- PRCR are invited to present at the Black History Month program on Feb. 22.
