NOMINEE FOR CHAIR OF RCAC:

Shelley M. Winters (Chairperson, Atlantic CAC)

Shelley is employed as a Universal Care Manager with Wake County Human Resources. In this position she provides intensive case management and customer services with the Medicaid Program for over 300 low income families. She works with employment counselors to develop and implement strategies to assist families toward economic self-sufficiency. Her communication and marketing skills have helped her in developing and designing social media platforms to disseminate information for the Agency's 2012-2014 Strategic Plan. She has also served as editor for the 2015 Human Services Resources Guide.

In Shelley's own words: "I have a passion and commitment to Raleigh and her residents. In my brief time leading the Atlantic CAC, I have worked to make meetings available to all via social media and notes available in Spanish for our Hispanic residents. I hope to take these practices and streamline them throughout all of the CACs, if elected. I also hope to learn about the needs and concerns of each CAC and try to find solutions for the RCAC and city government can be a better support. These are just some of the ideas I hope to bring to our residents. As some may know, my family has lived here and served her residents since 1794, and I consider it an honor to carry their mantle of service forward."

NOMINEES FOR FIRST VICE-CHAIR OF RCAC:

Terri Becom (Vice-Chairperson, North Central CAC)

Retired from GlaxoSmithKline, where she worked as a Medical Data Scientist in HIV research, Terri has served as the Vice Chair of North Central CAC for over 2 years and also serve as the CAC liaison for Historic Oakwood's SPHO board. Terri is a member of Raleigh HER (Homelessness Engagement Roundtable) and serves as Local Missions Communicator for Presbyterian Women of First Presbyterian Church. She also acts as co-chair for Family Promise of Wake County via First Presbyterian Church. "We along with 35 other churches in Raleigh host homeless families in our church for one week. Our church does this four weeks a year." Terri is a member of the Oakwood Awesomettes, a baton twirling group for women of a certain age, and a docent for the NC Museum of History.

Terri has been an avid runner for 40 years, practices yoga, and loves to garden.

In Terri's own words: "My favorite activity is spending time with my children, 5 grandchildren and my husband Don. We share our home with (2) 17 year old cats and our border collie Sophie. I am used to doing presentations and speaking in front of others. I believe that we must work in our communities to help improve them."

Michael O’Sullivan (Chairperson, North CAC)

Michael has been retired from active employment since 2013; however, he continues to do some consulting work for GE. He worked in financial management as CFO and then as President of Thales Mackay Radio. He was also employed as CFO for several other companies, several associated with GE.

While living in Maryland he was a member of the St. Joseph’s Parish Council from 1978-1983 and was also active with their basketball, softball, and baseball programs.
