Meeting Minutes July 10, 2017

1. Mr. Charles Rodman called the South Citizens Advisory Council's meeting to order on July 10, 2017 at 7:00 PM.
Announcement:
 - a. **THERE WILL BE NO MEETING IN THE MONTH OF AUGUST**
2. The minutes from June 12, 2017 were read and approved.
3. Senior Officer Leggett reported there has been an increase in residential burglaries and motor vehicles being stolen and broken into, there were three separate reports of shots being fired in three random neighborhoods.
 - a. Senior Officer Leggett, reminded neighbors to lock doors and windows to their homes, and stated that most burglars enter homes through unlocked side doors and back windows. He encouraged all to double check locks before leaving home, as to prevent homes from becoming easy targets for would be burglars.
 - b. Two vehicles left unattended were stolen; make sure to never leave vehicles unattended, and remember to take keys with you when exiting.
 - c. The Raleigh Police Department was able to make several arrests in recent burglaries due to the help of calls received from neighbors. **See Something, Say Something.** Let's help Raleigh Police Officers help you keep the neighborhoods and residents safe.
4. Deputy Police Chief J.C. Perry wore a Body Camera to the South CAC meeting to demonstrate the operational instructions on how and when body cameras are worn by on duty officers.
5. The demonstration will be conducted throughout all of Raleigh Citizens Advisory Councils to solicit feedback and input from citizens throughout the City of Raleigh, as Raleigh Police Department moves closer to introducing the Body Camera Program.
6. The Raleigh Police Department distributed DRAFT copies of instructions on body-worn cameras and mobile video recordings. A **DRAFT** copy was provided to the CAC residents to obtain feedback and input concerning the drafted document before a **final version** is created.
7. To obtain the DRAFT Departmental Operating Instructions (DOI) for the Raleigh Police Department's Body Camera program visit the website at www.raleighnc.gov. This website contains the following information:

Department as we work to finalize our DOI**

8. Community Engagement: Pam Adderley informed the group of:

Flood-Prone Properties Restored to Green Space

The City of Raleigh's Stormwater Management Division has had many successes over the last year through its participation in the Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Flood Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. The program provides funding to the City when it purchases properties, like Capital Inn on Capital Boulevard in Raleigh, that experience ongoing flooding as a result of being built in the floodplain prior to current development regulations. After a property is purchased, the area is restored to green space so that the floodplain functions more naturally. This reduces flooding in the area and improves public safety. Participation in the program is voluntary. Some projects may also be funded through the City's Stormwater Utility.
