Minutes from June 12, 2017 meeting, recorded by South CAC Secretary, Geri White

1. Dr. Norman Camp called the South CAC meeting to order on June 12, 2017 at 7:00 PM.
2. Last month's meeting minutes have been read and approved by South CAC members.

City of Raleigh Department Reports

3. Raleigh Police Stat Report: Senior Officer Leggett
 - a. Senior Officer Leggett explained the codes listed on the South CAC Police incident report ex: (INA= inactive case, A= active cases, C= close, N=null).
 - b. Senior Officer Leggett reported that in the past 28 days there was a rise in shootings in the South CAC, but weren't considered random as victims and suspects knew each other. There were also 6 assaults and arrests.
 - c. Residential burglaries were up as well: 14 burglaries of vacant houses, houses under construction, and homes that were entered through unlocked or open backdoors and windows. Most of the burglaries occurred between work hours: 10:00 am - 4:00 pm.
 - d. Senior Officer Leggett reported that there has also been an increase of breaks-ins or entrances into unlocked motor vehicles throughout the city. These incidents usually occurred between midnight and early morning hours. He asked citizens to beware that would-be burglars are driving through various neighborhoods looking for unlocked motor vehicles. He urged all to remove valuables from sight and to lock all doors; remember, **"See something, Say Something, and help Police keep you and your valuables safe"**.
 - e. Ms. Alexander reported that since the last CAC meeting, there have been fewer dirt bike sightings in her neighborhood. She thanked the RPD for their attention in helping to reduce the presence of dirt bikes on the streets.
 - f. Mr. Merritt from Dillmark Court requested assistance from the RPD to eliminate some of the homeowners' problems and frustrations regarding individuals who do not live in their neighborhood, but leave abandoned vehicles parked in the neighbors' parking spaces in the neighborhood. The Residents of Dillmark Court asked Officer Leggett how they could get faster response from Raleigh Police Department when calling 911.
 - g. Officer Leggett reminded residents that when they call 911, they can always remain unanimous, if you so desire. A request was made for the hedges near Food Lion to be trimmed back, to provide better visibility for drivers. Residents are still requesting speed monitoring on Sanderford Road and Idlewood Village. Raleigh Police Officer say speed survey recorded the

average driver at 35.8 mph and they do not write tickets unless you are traveling 10 miles over the posted speed limit.

4. Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Resources: Sanderford Center Director, Tori Spaugh
 - a) The center offers the following programs
 - o Zumba Toning on Tuesday & Wednesday night at 7– 8 pm for \$5 class
 - o Fun Friday 6-8pm : Fun and games, while parents have time out
 - o Neighborhood Ecology Corps (NEC) for grades 6-8, beginning in Aug. (Afternoon Middle School program focusing on nature and community. Program encourages youth to learn about ecology, science, and environmental stewardship. *For further information about the NEC Program contact Randy Senzig or Iris Senzig at 919-270-9682 or 919 270-8876. 5. Community Engagement Division: Community Specialist, Ms. Pam Adderley
 - a. Pam requested information from the South CAC members on how they intended to spend the Community Awareness Funds for the 2016-2017 fiscal years, ending in June 2017.
 - b. The group has agreed to spend all the funds on meeting signs to increase CAC awareness and participation for all its encompassing communities.
 - c. The group will have a better opportunity to plan events and activities, as Pam will provide quarterly budget updates to the group.

6. Parks, Recreation, and Cultural Resources: Biltmore Presentation

Mr. Ken Hisler, along with Mr. Kenneth Lyons, and David Bell from Park, Recreation, and Cultural Resources was present with updates on Biltmore Hills Park Improvements & Southeast Raleigh Tennis Center.

 - a. Capital Improvements to Biltmore includes:
 - o Community Center (Gym HVAC; Accessibility; Data Upgrades; Enhanced Entry; Reception Area)
 - o Tennis Center (8 New Courts; Resurfaced Courts; Building Addition)
 - o Public Art (Office of Raleigh Arts; Open call to the Southeast USA; Finalist Chosen)

7. City Councilman Corey Branch reminded everyone of the bond issues that are being discussed for funding for various construction projects throughout the City of Raleigh.
