


Additional severe weather expected across central NC today





Ingredients are in place again today across central North Carolina for severe storms capable of producing damaging straight-line winds, large hail, and a few tornadoes






Flash Flooding Concerns



There will be a potential for urban, poor drainage and small creek flash flooding with any of the slower moving heavy storms, or across locations that see repetitive downpours. A flash flood watch is in effect through 6 AM Thursday.

River Flooding Concerns Later this Week

Count on at least some minor flooding along the Tar and Cape Fear Rivers later this week and into the weekend. Flooding is possible along the Neuse River as well, but confidence is less.



If more rain falls than currently expected, look for these forecasts to worsen. However, if less rain falls, river flooding threat will lessen.

Take-aways for central NC

- Severe thunderstorm risk will continue any time this afternoon and evening.
 - All of central NC is at risk, but SPC probabilities favor areas west of I-95.
 - Several severe thunderstorms with damaging straight-line wind gusts and large hail expected.
 - A few tornadoes also possible.
- A Flash Flood Watch is in effect for all of central NC through 6 AM Thursday. Urban, poor drainage and small creek flash flooding is possible with any of the slower moving heavy storms, or across locations that see repetitive downpours.
- At least some minor river flooding expected along several central NC rivers later this week into the weekend.
