




Northwest Raleigh Bicycle Corridors Study

Purpose:

The purpose of this information session and survey is to gauge public interest and support for the individual segments of the Northwest Raleigh Bicycle Corridor Study which is comprised of Lumley Road, Westgate Road, Ebenezer Church Road, and US-70 (Glenwood Avenue) pedestrian and bicycle improvements.

Goal:

The goal of this information session and survey is to aid in prioritizing each segment along the corridor so that the most practical funding strategy can be implemented to design and construct the project within the City’s Budget. The feedback and information gathered from this information session and survey will be used by City staff to determine the extent of the short term and long term funding goals of each segment. Based on this evaluation, City staff will make recommendations as to which segments should be considered for design and construction funding, and in which order they should be implemented.

Project Overview:

The proposed project begins on Lumley Road at the intersection with Brier Creek Parkway, and terminates near Umstead State Park at the Ebenezer Church Road / Graylyn Road entrance (one route terminates at Leesville Road). The project proposes bicycle and pedestrian upgrades to the existing street networks. The type of improvement is dependent on the adjacent roadway, and will be in the form of bike lanes or parallel 10 ft. wide multi-use path.

There are 3 distinct routes identified and being considered that are comprised of the 6 individual segments shown above. The City appreciates your time and input on the project, and your help in selecting the preferred routing.

This project is being led by the City of Raleigh Public Works Department and Design/Construction Division in partnership with The Office of Transportation Planning and Parks, Recreation and Cultural Resources Department.
