



CONSTRUCTION SEQUENCE (City of Raleigh)

1. Obtain Grading Permit
2. Install gravel construction pad, temporary diversions, silt fencing and sediment basins as shown on the plan. Clear only as necessary to install these devices.
3. Call 800-3653 for on-site inspection by Conservation Inspector. If approved, begin clearing and grubbing.
4. Maintain devices as needed. Rough grade site.
5. Install storm sewer (if shown) and protect ditches with silt fencing, sediment traps or other approved measures as shown on the plan. Begin construction of building.
6. Stabilize site as areas are brought up to finish grade with vegetation, paving, etc.
7. When construction is complete and all areas are stabilized completely, call for inspection by Conservation Inspector.
8. If site is approved, remove temporary diversions, silt fencing, sediment basins, etc. and seed out or pave any resulting bare areas.
9. When vegetation has become established, call for final site inspection by Conservation Inspector.

Grassing Notes (Plant & Species)

Grass Seed: "Once and done" areas to be grassed starting on the following day following into the 100% of 100%.

Limbs: Limbs shall be applied to all areas to be grassed at a rate of 100 pounds per 1000 square feet. Limbs shall be ground organic material meeting North Carolina Department of Agriculture standards for fineness and purity of local collection.


Fertilizer: Fertilizer shall be applied at a rate of 30 pounds per 1000 square feet. Fertilizer shall be 10-10-10. Other formulas may be used if the application rate is adjusted based on amount of Nitrogen, Phosphorus, and Potassium by the actual to the application specified.

* All other rates based on dry weight of seed unless otherwise specified.

Seed: Use Ryegrass if Fescue where indicated on the plan at a rate of 6 pounds per 1000 square feet. All seed shall be certified seed meeting standards of purity as required by the United States Department of Agriculture.

Mulch: All grassed areas shall be mulched with clean green wood chips or straw and kept in place until the grass is established. Mulch shall be applied at a rate of 100 gallons per 1000 sq. ft. Other rates may be used at a minimum rate of 50 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft.

Water: All grassed areas shall be watered with clean water. Water shall be applied at a rate of 100 gallons per 1000 sq. ft. Other rates may be used at a minimum rate of 50 lbs. per 1000 sq. ft.




DETAIL A RAMP
1/12" = 1'-0"


DETAIL B Brick Wall


DETAIL L TEMP. DIVERSION DITCH







FROM 1955 TO 1966 THE EQUILIBRIUM OF AMERICAN SOCIETY WAS ROCKED BY WAVES OF SOCIAL AND POLITICAL PROTEST. 
