site accessibility

Sites, buildings, structures, facilities, pedestrian tunnels or walkways, elements & spaces must be provided with pedestrian access and shall be accessible to persons with physical disabilities in accordance with the North Carolina Building Code, ICC A117.1 – 2009 Accessible and Useable Buildings & Facilities and Part 10, Article E, Sec. 10-2091 Pedestrian Access of the City of Raleigh Code of Ordinances. Before any site, building, structure or facility may be used or occupied, it must be approved by the Inspections Department of the City of Raleigh, NC.

sidewalks

pedestrian accommodations

All sidewalks must allow for safe pedestrian access and meet ADA requirements. Sidewalk closures result in re-routing of pedestrian traffic and must be reviewed by the Transportation Field Services Division of Public Works for permit issuance. Tunnels or walkways constructed for the safe movement of pedestrians must pass a building inspection.

lane closures

All lane closures must allow for safe vehicular traffic flow. Travel lane with or without on street parking must be approved for closure by the Transportation Operations Division of Public Works for permit issuance. Travel lanes with or without on street parking can be used for re-routing pedestrian traffic, construction dumpsters, re-routing of vehicular traffic, and house moves.

Work zone traffic control ensures the needs of pedestrians, including those with disabilities, are addressed in temporary traffic control plans in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA). The ADA is a Federal law that requires that pedestrians with disabilities be accommodated not only in completed, publicly accessible facilities, but also during times of construction or improvement. The City of Raleigh is dedicated to ensuring all pedestrians, including the disabled, are provided safe, accessible, and reasonably convenient paths that replicate as nearly as practical the characteristics of the existing pedestrian circulation.


