Dear Mrs. Fields,

Please see below per our conversation on October 11, 2013 concerning the trees at 702 North Blount St.

Looking at the front of the house from Blount Street, on the right hand side in the front corner by the fence is a small maple that the top has broken out of. The tree has a compromised base and weeping cankers along the trunk. It is my recommendation that the tree be removed.

Along Pace St. is a large maple, 15.5" diameter breast height (DBH). This tree has multiple problems; the tree has sustained damage lately evidenced by the deadwood and cracked bits in the crown. Cavities exist in various leaders and a broken, steel, bracing cable hangs limp.

There is a cavity at the base of the tree and a sounding test, using the back of an ax head, leads me to believe the hollow is significant. The maple is bending away from the house and is growing over the sidewalk, many utility lines and parking spaces. In short, the majority of the tree's weight is on one side, the Pace St. side, and is pulling away from the already weakened buttress roots on the opposite side of the tree.

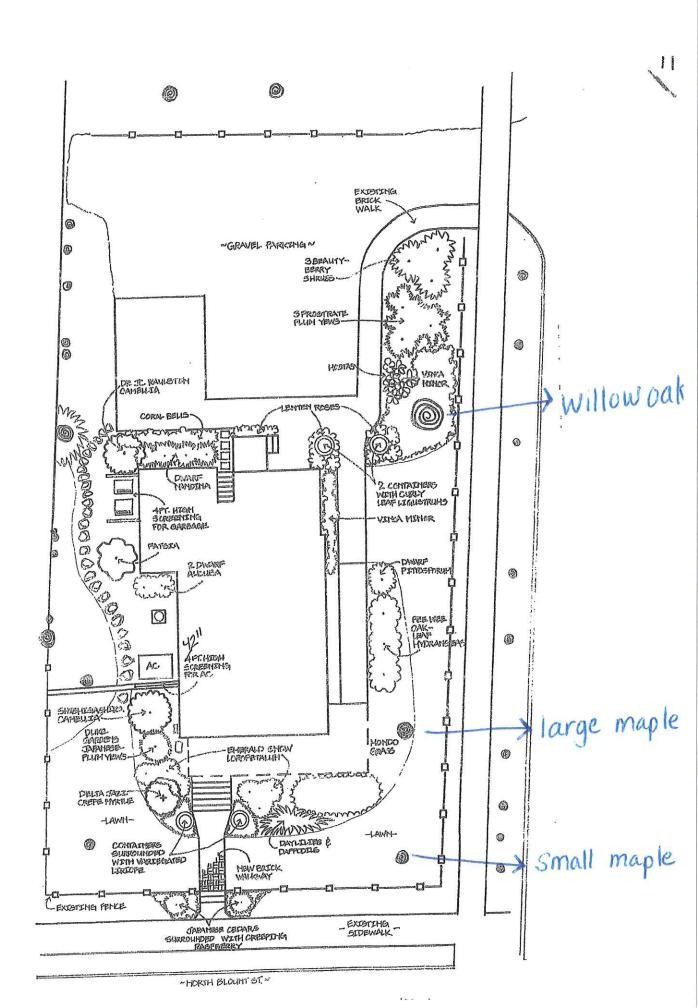
Although the tree could be pruned to reduce the weight over the street I would recommend removal. In my opinion the target area is too great to persons and property should some of the tree or the whole tree fail.

Also on Pace St. near driveway is a large Willow Oak, 29.5" DBH. This tree should have major deadwood removed and I would trim it out of and away from the utility lines.

I hope you find this report helpful and I am happy to be of assistance.

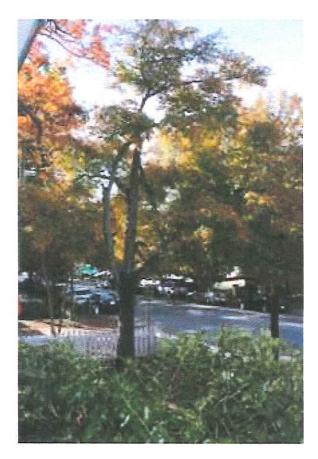
