



- 1. <u>Written Description</u>: We propose to remove the dead/declining Sycamore tree located at the front, south-western portion of the lot (as depicted on Photo 1 below). As indicated in the attached conversation with an arborist, the Sycamore has an irreversible bacterial infection that is slowly killing the tree. We plan to replace the Sycamore with a juvenile Sycamore during the appropriate planting season.
- 2. <u>Description of Materials</u>: We will obtain a replacement juvenile Sycamore.
