

CAC boundary background

- ❑ Boundary change discussions and negotiations started in 2000
- ❑ Some boundary changes are contentious between CACs
- ❑ CAC boundary changes offered here today have been affirmed by CAC leaders and CAC members
- ❑ CACs exist to:
 - Give people a voice
 - Educate citizens
- ❑ These changes are an expression of CAC member needs and will strengthen those CACs' ability to fulfill their roles



CAC boundary organizing principles

1. NEIGHBORHOOD CHARACTERISTICS

- Individual neighborhood integrity (don't split neighborhoods)
- Affinity of neighborhood aggregates
 - Geographic proximity to one another
 - Common issues, such as development

2. NATURAL & MANMADE BOUNDARIES

- Rivers, streams, natural features
- Highways, major streets, railroads
- Parks, landfills, shopping centers, industrial sites, etc.

3. POPULATION (1974 CAC size was 7,000-14,000)

4. CENTRAL MEETING PLACE (safe, right size, good facilities, adequate parking)





- Each CAC was to encompass an area of “7,000 - 14,000 people”
- Many fewer than 7,000
- Far greater than 14,000

BOUNDARY CHANGES

- Southwest (Jason Hibbets) – Slight boundary changes with Hillsborough, Central, and West
- Hillsborough (Will Allen) – slight boundary change with Southwest (addition of Pullen Park Terrace)
- Central (Lionette Williams) – Slight boundary change with Southwest
- West (Mark Vander Borgh) – Slight boundary change with Southwest

SPLIT + BOUNDARY CHANGE

- Northeast (Paul Brant) – Slight boundary change with Falls, Six Forks, East, & Southeast + split into two new CACs, with I-540 as the boundary between the two new CACs
- East Raleigh (Mark Turner) – Slight boundary change with Northeast
- Southeast – Slight boundary change with Northeast

MERGER / BOUNDARY CHANGE

- Falls of Neuse (Chad Ingham) & Six Forks (Patrick Martin) – Merge and renamed Midtown CAC
- Atlantic CAC (not organized) – Created from remainder of Falls & Six Forks + a piece of Northeast
