Pleasant Valley Road Improvements Part of 2013 Transportation Bond

Motorists, pedestrians, and adjacent businesses along the half-mile of Pleasant Valley Road between Glenwood Avenue and Duraleigh Road would be the beneficiaries of a new road construction project along this street if Raleigh voters approve the 2013 bond referendum on the October 8 ballot.

The proposed project would repair deteriorated parts of the road. The proposed improvements include widening the street to three lanes, with one lane in each direction and a center turn lane. Sidewalks and bike lanes would be constructed and street lights would be installed. The new sidewalks would improve access to existing bus routes with stops located at each end of the corridor.

The total cost of the \$3,766,000 project would be funded by revenues from the 2013 bond issue.

Raleigh voters approved transportation bond referenda in 1984, 1987, 1998, 2000, 2005 and 2011, for a total of \$250 million.
