CONSTRUCTION UNDER WAY ON HILLSBOROUGH STREET ROUNDBABOUTS PROJECT

During the week of June 1 through 5, construction crews will be conducting the following activities during daytime hours:

- Installing block walls in the basement of Red, Hot, & Blue restaurant;
- Installing duct bank for underground utilities on the south side of Hillsborough Street between Gardner and Pogue streets;
- Excavating and preparing to install water and sewer lines between the south side of Hillsborough Street and the Court of the Carolinas near Tompkins Hall;
- Installing water lines, sewer lines, and the utility duct bank on the south side of Hillsborough Street, starting near Tompkins Hall and heading west towards Gardner Street; and,
- Installing storm drains along Pullen Road and the future Pullen Road extension, from the south side of Hillsborough Street north to Oberlin Road.

Construction crews will be conducting night-time construction near the Hillsborough Street intersections at Pullen and Oberlin roads, including:

- Installing manholes and sewer lines starting at the Hillsborough/Oberlin intersection, moving west to Pullen Road and the Wardlaw Building, and then north along Ferndell Lane.

Hillsborough Street should remain open to traffic during these nighttime activities. However, crews may need to temporarily close Hillsborough Street between Oberlin and Pullen roads or Ferndell Lane during the work.

**POGUE STREET AREA TO EXPERIENCE TEMPORARY POWER OUTAGE
MAY 30 DUE TO HILLSBOROUGH STREET CONSTRUCTION**

Neighborhoods and businesses in the area of Pogue Street will be without power on Saturday, May 30 from 7 a.m. to 11 a.m. due to construction related to Phase I of the Hillsborough Street Roundabouts Project.

The planned power outage is needed to accommodate the removal of an overhead electrical feeder on Hillsborough Street in front of North Carolina State University. Crews hope to complete the work in less than the scheduled four hours. If the work cannot be done on May 30 due to inclement weather or other issue, it will be rescheduled to Saturday, June 6 from 7 a.m. to 11 a.m.
