

Adopted BPAC 2018-2019 Work Plan

General Commission Initiatives:

- Coordinate and participate in the annual Triangle Bicycle & Pedestrian Workshop
- Provide input on the proposed Comprehensive Plan Update
- Promote the City's application for Walk Friendly Community designation
- Promote improving the City's current bronze-level Bike Friendly City designation
- Receive quarterly reports on bicycle and pedestrian crash data
- Build capacity and public support for an Open Streets event
- Stay in touch with the Raleigh Police Liaison and receive updates
- Coordinate access to transit initiatives with GoRaleigh and GoTriangle to promote sidewalk and bus stop amenity improvements (benches, shelters, bike racks, sidewalk gaps, etc.), and receive ongoing updates on transit planning
- Work with City of Raleigh to move toward implementation of a Vision Zero policy to improve safety for all road users
- Continue coordination with Parks, Recreation and Greenway advisory board to promote greenways for transportation and special events
- Review and advise for the Downtown Raleigh transportation plan with focus on creation of a Downtown Loop trail; and promote equal access for all Raleigh communities

Bicycle Planning Committee:

- Promote the ongoing implementation of the 2016 BikeRaleigh Plan
 - Investigate and make Bike Plan policy recommendations related to bikeshare and dockless bikeshare
 - Investigate and make Bike Plan policy recommendations related to electric assist and e-bikes
- Research and develop an On-Road Bicycle Wayfinding & Signage Plan that enhances existing infrastructure, improves the usability of the bicycle network, and encourages short bicycle trips
 - Coordinate integration of the On-Road Bicycle Wayfinding & Signage Plan with the Urban Trees and Trails Committee of the Parks, Recreation and Greenway Advisory Board
 - Coordinate with the Urban Trees and Trails Committee of the Parks, Recreation and Greenway Advisory Board and the East Coast Greenway Alliance to amend the BikeRaleigh Plan to reference and include support for the East Coast Greenway
- Promote the implementation of Raleigh's Bikeshare Program
- Review and support the Annual Street Resurfacing with Bicycle Marking implementation
- Work on a Bike Parking Program for private properties in Raleigh
- Review the City's typical street sections in the Unified Development Ordinance and compare against current best practices for cycling facilities and infrastructure

Pedestrian Planning Committee:

- Promote WalkRaleigh Brand; support staff efforts to update website
- Identify and expand the use of leading pedestrian interval signals at (three) additional high traffic locations
- Advocate for more targeted crosswalk enforcement campaigns through the City in conjunction with the Watch For Me NC Campaign
- Coordinate with City staff to develop a sidewalk maintenance outreach campaign that may include
 - Promote access to pedestrian safety outreach and walkability audits to identify repairs and improvements
 - Promote SeeClickFix reporting for sidewalk and pedestrian improvements
 - Get updates on sidewalk maintenance expenditures and projects throughout the city
- Advocate for the implementation, and assist with the updating of the City's various Corridor and Master Plan Studies, including Gateways, Transit, Parks, etc. (Ongoing)
- Promote October as "Walktober" by creating and promoting a calendar of walking events, as well as conducting three walking related events in and around the city
- Promote pedestrian facts and figures to share with everyone we meet, promote the city's efforts (Ongoing)
- Identify other city committees for opening up cross communication to create synergy for pedestrian issues
- Analyze crash data to help Raleigh determine areas of critical need for pedestrian improvements; work with staff to form recommendations on treatment options to enhance safety
- Assess gaps in current policy for pedestrian right-of-way in an ongoing construction zone

Community Outreach Committee:

- Promote public participate and interaction with bike/pedestrian initiatives, such as Bike Month activities, bikeshare, Walktober, sidewalk funding and expansion process, and Open Streets events
- Promote and attend Safe Routes to School initiatives and attend Bike to School and Walk to School activities
- Visit and present to community groups of various types throughout the year
- Initiate a Speaker Series of national experts to discuss strategic and innovative transportation topics, including transit, bicycling and walking, and housing equity
- Support public involvement and improve accessibility to BPAC committee materials and meetings
