City of Raleigh Museum (COR Museum) Hosts Smithsonian Institution Exhibit: Beyond Bollywood

The Smithsonian Institution's traveling exhibition, "Beyond Bollywood: Indian Americans Shape the Nation," is coming to the City of Raleigh Museum (COR Museum). The first-of-its-kind exhibition opens Oct. 29 and will run through April 2, 2017, at the Downtown museum located at 220 Fayetteville St. in Suite 220. The 5,000-square-foot exhibit details the history of Indian Americans and their contributions to the United States from the 1700s to the present. Raleigh will be the inaugural traveling exhibit's first stop in the Southeast. The exhibit was created by the Smithsonian Asian Pacific American Center and the Smithsonian Institution Traveling Exhibition Service.
