North Central CAC Regular Meeting Summary April 9, 2019

- A. Welcome-** Octavia Rainey, CAC Chair, welcomed everyone to the CAC meeting. Last month's meeting minutes were reviewed and approved.
- B. Parks, Recreation and Cultural Resources Report-** Chris Octetree, Tarboro Center Director, highlighted upcoming center events. Highlighted events: Rock the Block event, Summer Camp registration, RPD basketball registration, and adult kickball registration.
- C. Police Report-** Officer Lee reported on the past 30 days crime statistics and gave tips on deterring crime. He also shared information on the upcoming Rock the Block event.

- D. Fair Housing Month Presentation-** Collin Bober, Raleigh Fair Housing Hearing Board Outreach chair, presented on the history of the Fair Housing Act. He highlighted the purpose of the Fair Housing Act and who it protects. Local and national enforcement agencies were shared, and discussion was had on the City's responsibility. Attendees discussed the displacement of Smokey Hollow and Fort Ward residents and churches in the 1970's.
- E. Potential Rezoning Case-** Tom Johnson, Williams Mullen, shared information regarding a potential rezoning of property at the southeast portion of Capital Blvd & Peace Street. The private developer, Zimmer Development, is requesting the rezoning. The rezoning requested is DX-40 and the location is considered the northern gateway into downtown. The developers are working on negotiating a pedestrian connection above or below the train bridge. They are proposing to have BRT access with a bus stop near the property. They will have retail on the ground level and mixed use above. The property may have a hotel, residential units, commercial rental spaces or a combination of all.

Questions/ Comments:

Residents inquired about parking and a parking structure. The developer will do a traffic study. Residents asked about affordable housing for the property. There is no specific construction timeline yet. The developer plans to return to CAC in May and June.

- F. North Central History Walking Tour-** Octavia Rainey, CAC Chair, gave an update on the CAC History Walking Tour. The walk will begin at Tarboro Rd Center and go down Tarboro Street to St. Agnes Hospital. Along the tour, people will speak about historical locations & events that took place. The tour will be a Saturday in June.
- G. Upcoming Meetings-** In May the CAC will select a nominating committee for CAC elections. The CAC Chair is working on hosting a CAC meeting at the Burning Coal Theatre.

City of Raleigh Digital Connectors Program

Digital Connectors is a 9-month program for youth (ages 14 – 18) who live in the City of Raleigh. The program runs from September until May and concludes with a graduation ceremony.

Participants learn skills in technology, leadership, civic engagement, financial literacy and professional development. Digital Connectors serve as ambassadors to the mission of bridging the digital divide through a variety of technology focused volunteer activities.

Students completing the 9-month program and its requirements receive a laptop computer and a \$500 dollar stipend! 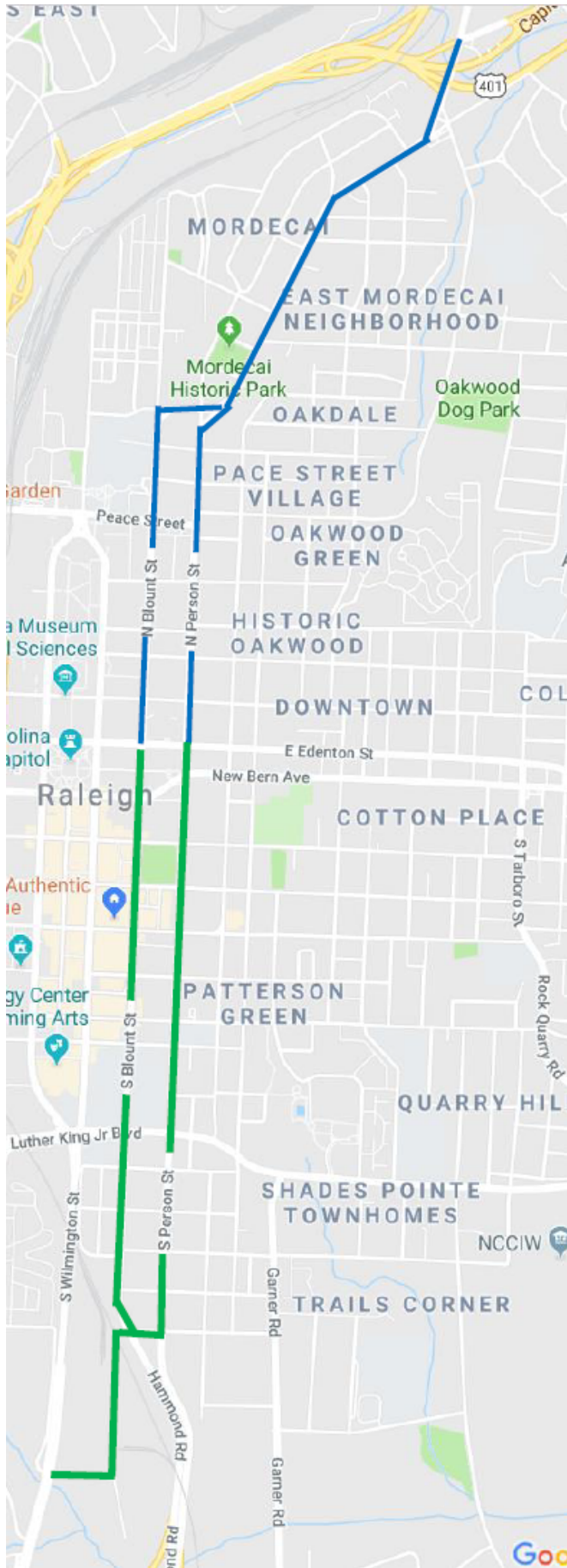

Road Construction Project on Wake Forest Road, Blount Street and Person Street



The City of Raleigh expects Phase One of the Blount – Person Streets Complete Streets Project to begin Construction in July or August of 2019.

The roads marked in blue will have the old asphalt removed (called milling) and have new asphalt surface placed. Sidewalk curb ramps that are non-standard will be replaced. The new surface will be marked according to a new plan that includes bicycle lanes and a maximum of two through lanes on Blount and Person Streets. Some on-street parking changes will occur.

Wake Forest Road will be marked with one motor vehicle lane and one bicycle lane in each direction, with a center two-way left turn lane.

THERE ARE NO CHANGES FROM ONE-WAY TO TWO-WAY IN PHASE ONE.

The streets marked in green will have pavement marking changes only; no asphalt paving. All three-lane sections will be reduced to two through lanes, and continuous bicycle lanes will be placed. Parking will be allowed along some curbs but not others depending on the width of the road and the widths needed for bicycle and motor vehicle lanes. Sharrows (markings that indicate to motorists to expect bicycle traffic and indicate to cyclists a recommended lane position) will be placed on South Blount Street south of Hoke Street to City Farm Road to make a bicycle route connection to the Walnut Creek Greenway.
