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OUR PURPOSE

The Raleigh Police Department's Citizens Police Academy is designed to increase transparency and to enhance understanding between the community and the police. Through knowledge and understanding, this adult training model provides:

- Knowledge of the philosophy, policies and guiding principles of law enforcement and the ethical conduct requirements governing police services in our community.
- Enhanced community knowledge and insight regarding the operations and services of the Raleigh Police Department.
- Information pertaining to the department's approach to community policing.
- Understanding of the rigorous training and demanding instruction provided to police recruits and officers.
- More effective communication between the community and the police officers who serve them.
- Opportunities to increase community partnerships.
- Stronger, more resilient relationships between the department and the community.

OUR GOALS

- To provide an interactive and engaging introduction to police operations, procedures, and protocols.
- To receive feedback that aids the department as it strives to communicate most effectively with the community.
- To better understand the public safety and quality-of-life concerns of community members.
- To convey knowledge of safe, helpful ways in which the community can assist the department as it seeks to make Raleigh an even better place to live, work, play, and learn.

- To receive community input that can be used to enhance the services and programs provided by the department.

WHO CAN ATTEND?

Those attending must be at least 21 years old and will be drawn from a cross-section of the community. Applicants must live or work in the city of Raleigh.

The benefit of the academy's instructional program and interactions can be magnified through sharing, so there is an interest in attracting community leaders and those who wish to assume more active roles in Raleigh. In addition, media representatives who are willing to share their academy experiences through journalism are encouraged to apply.

WHEN WILL THE ACADEMY BE OFFERED AND HOW LONG WILL IT BE?

The Raleigh Police Department Citizens Academy will accommodate approximately 20 - 25 community participants. The academy is held once or twice per year, depending upon interest and available resources.

The Citizens Police Academy is a 10-week course. Classroom instruction will take place once a week during evening hours, typically from 6 - 9 p.m. When dates are established, we ask that potential applicants first review their calendars to ensure they can commit to participating throughout the duration of the program.

WHAT TOPICS WILL BE COVERED?

Below is the basic instructional schedule. The topics and order of instruction may vary.

Week 1-Orientation

Department Overview and Structure; Policy Distribution; Volunteer Programs; Recruiting, Selection and Training of Officers

Week 2-Communications

Emergency Communications; Radio/Mobile Computer Terminal; Role of the Police Public Affairs Office

Week 3-Overview of Legal System

Constitutional Law & Arrest Search and Seizure; Use of Force; Non-Biased Policing; Office of Professional Standards/Internal Affairs

Week 4-Specialized Units

K9 & Mounted; Driving While Impaired (DWI); Crash Reconstruction; Selective Enforcement; Crisis Intervention

Week 5-Patrol and Investigative Techniques

Drug Recognition; Gang Awareness; Investigative Case Review; Body-Worn Cameras

Week 6-Specialized Units

Family Violence Intervention; Youth and Family Services; School Resource Officers; Crime Prevention Community Officers; Intelligence and Analysis

Week 7-Practical Exercises

Reality-Based Training Demo/Building Searches; Simulator Training; Driving Course

Week 8-Ride Alongs

Week 9-Forensics/Crime Scene Processing
