The drum is an ancient tool of communication and community building. Drum Cafe is a team building company that uses drumming as an interactive form of breaking down barriers, establishing group alignment, and exploring the diversity within a group.



The Drum Cafe drum circle is based on two key principles which create successful group dynamics:  
1. Everyone plays the same bass rhythm; and, 2. Everyone listens to one another.

By following these principles the Drum Cafe is able to build a non-competitive community and convey the message that everyone in the group is striving to achieve the same goal - to make music that is harmonious.

Participants will beat their own drums and hear the rhythm of the group change and develop. They will realize they are playing a specific, important role within the group. Participants directly experience the power of group energy and understand that they are united by a common goal. ## KEYNOTE SPEAKER: MARCHELL ADAMS DAVID



### **Marchell Adams David, City of Raleigh Assistant City Manager for Community**

As Assistant City Manager for Community, Marchell Adams David serves as liaison to the following departments: Emergency Communications; Emergency Management/Special Events; Fire; Housing and Neighborhoods; Parks, Recreation and Cultural Resources; and Police. Ms. Adams David understands the importance of community involvement on all levels.

Before joining the City of Raleigh senior management team as Raleigh's Assistant City Manager for Community, Ms. Adams David, was the City Manager of the City of Hamlet, a position she had held since 2001. One of Ms. Adams David's main accomplishments during her tenure at Hamlet was to form partnerships that led to the relocation and resoundingly successful restoration of the landmark Hamlet Passenger Depot, which helped the town re-brand itself "Hub of the Seaboard"—and instilled a much-needed sense of pride of place. This project earned her project team the distinguished Gertrude S. Carraway Award of Merit from Preservation North Carolina.

Ms. Adams David received her bachelor's degree in public policy analysis with a specialization in state and local government administration from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, where she also received a master's degree in public administration with a specialization in public management. She currently serves on the North Carolina Arts Council Board of Directors and is a member of the United Way's Emergency Food and Shelter Program for Richmond County. For the past 15 years, Ms. Adams David has served as an adjunct professor at the University of North Carolina at Pembroke, instructing students on the principles of American government, political science, and state and local government. In addition to being named the Region N Manager of the Year by the Lumber River Council of Governments in 2005, Ms. Adams David received the Richmond County 2014 NAACP Humanitarian of the Year Award in 2014.
