Pursuant to the General Statutes of North Carolina, Section 143-128 et. seq, sealed proposals are invited and will be received by the City of Raleigh in the office of the Stormwater Management Division until 10:00 am, on Monday, September 12<sup>th</sup>, 2016 at which time at a meeting in Conference Room on 8<sup>th</sup> floor, 127 W. Hargett Street, Raleigh, N.C., the sealed proposals will be publicly opened for construction consisting of furnishing and installing the following:

Rehabilitation of an existing dam and spillway structure including furnishing all materials, labor, tools, and equipment for the construction work necessary to excavate the existing embankment, construct a new riser spillway structure, outlet conduit, stilling basin, and a riprap channel lining. Work also includes installing water valves and removing the existing water line in the embankment, demolishing the existing spillway bridge, excavation and reconstruction of the embankment to the lines and grades shown on the drawings, replacement of the water line and reconstruction of Albemarle Avenue.

A Mandatory Pre-Bid Conference for all contractors will be held at 9:00 am (until 11:00 am) on Wednesday, August 10<sup>th</sup>, 2016 in Conference Room on 8<sup>th</sup> floor, 127. W. Hargett Street, Raleigh, North Carolina. At such time the bidder's company information and contact information will be recorded on the project's official bidders list. Bidders not recorded on the project's official bidders list will not be eligible for bidding. Sub-contractors and SDMWOB are welcomed to attend the Pre-Bid Conference, but their attendance is not mandatory. The Pre-bid Conference will immediately be followed by a mandatory site visit from 11:00 until 12:00 Noon.

From Monday, August 1<sup>st</sup>, 2016 until the date of opening the proposals, plans and specifications of the proposed work are and will continue to be on file in the office of the City of Raleigh Engineering Services, Stormwater Management Division, Professional Building, 127 W. Hargett Street – Suite 800 Raleigh, North Carolina, during usual office hours and will be available to prospective bidders. No proposal will be considered or accepted unless at the time of its filing, the same shall be accompanied by a cash deposit, cashier's check, or certified check on a bank or trust company insured by the FDIC and authorized to do business in North Carolina in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the proposal. In the alternative, a five percent (5%) bid bond issued by a corporate surety licensed by the State of North Carolina may be filed with the proposal. Bidders must be properly licensed under Chapter 87 of the General Statues of North Carolina and must comply with nondiscrimination provisions. The City is an equal opportunity Municipality/Owner and invites small and minority contractors to bid. The City Council reserves the right to reject any or all proposals.

Pursuant to General Statutes of North Carolina Sections 143-128 and 143-131 and to City policy, the City of Raleigh encourages and provides equal opportunity for certified Minority and Women-Owned Business Enterprise (MWBE) businesses to participate in all aspects of the City's contracting and procurement programs to include - Professional Services; Goods and Other Services; and Construction. The prime contractor will be required to identify participation of MWBE businesses in their proposal, and how that participation will be achieved.

Furthermore, the City's goal is to contract or sub-contract fifteen percent (15%) of the contract amount to Certified MWBEs on construction projects over \$300,000, or with contracts that include \$100,000 or more in state funding. The goal breakdown is 8% for minorities and 7% for non-minority females.
