Separate sealed Formal Bids will be received until 3:00 PM, Tuesday, November 29, 2016, at One Exchange Plaza, Conference Room 1- OEP- 6<sup>th</sup> Floor, Raleigh, NC 27602, at which time and place bids will be publicly opened and read aloud for the construction of the Lower Marsh Creek Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation project.

After Bids are opened, the Owner shall evaluate them in accordance with the methods and criteria set forth in the Instructions to Bidders. The Owner/City Council reserves the right to waive any informality or to reject any or all Bids. Unless all Bids are rejected, Award will be made to the lowest responsible Bidder, taking into consideration quality, performance and the time specified in the proposals for the performance of the Contract.

A **Mandatory** Pre-Bid Meeting will be held at **11:00 AM, Wednesday, November 16, 2016** at One Exchange Plaza, Conference Room 1- OEP- 6<sup>th</sup> Floor, Raleigh, NC 27602.

The Project consists of the following major items:

- Rehabilitation of approximately 1,550 linear feet of 24-inch, 1,000 linear feet of 30-inch, and 175 linear feet of 36-inch gravity sewer lines by CIPP.
- Rehabilitation of approximately 170 vertical feet of 5 foot diameter manholes, 25 vertical feet of 6 foot diameter manholes, and 20 vertical feet of 8 foot diameter manholes.
- Alternate bid will be included to replace 12 manholes in lieu of rehabilitation.

A hard copy or electronic copy of Bidding Documents may be obtained at the office of the Engineer upon providing a \$75.00 non-refundable fee for each set of documents, which includes all contracts.

With request for Bidding Documents supply the following information: Company name, contact person, street address, and phone and fax numbers for Bidding office; N. C. contractor's license with limitation and classification; indicate if the firm will be a Bidder, Supplier or Sub-Contractor.

Bidders will be required to show evidence that they are licensed to perform the work in the Bidding Documents as required by North Carolina General Statute, Chapter 87 and the Instruction to Bidders.

Bid Security in the amount of five percent of the Bid must accompany each Bid and shall be subject to the conditions provided in the Instruction to Bidders.

Pursuant to General Statutes of North Carolina Sections 143-128 and 143-131 and to City policy, the City of Raleigh encourages and provides equal opportunity for certified Minority and Woman-Owned Business Enterprise (MWBE) businesses to participate in all aspects of the City's contracting and procurement programs to include – Professional Services; Goods and Other Services; and Construction. The prime contractor will be required to identify participation of MWBE businesses in their proposal, and how that participation will be achieved.

Furthermore, the City's goal is to contract or sub-contract fifteen percent (15%) of the contract amount to certified MWBEs on construction projects over \$300,000, or with contracts that include \$100,000 or more in state funding. The goal breakdown is 8% for minorities and 7% for non-minority females. The Bidder must include completed minority or women-owned subcontractor documentation form(s) regardless of bid amount or the bids may be considered non-responsive and invalid.
