Birthday Programs

Our birthday party room looks out across our wide deck into the wetland forest behind the Center. It is a large room equipped with a sink and vinyl flooring to make clean ups easy. You may bring table or free standing decorations, but nothing may be affixed to the walls.



Wetland Wingding

Who lives in a wetland? Spend time with a nature instructor learning about some of the interesting animals that call the wetland home. Activities may include a puppet show, story time, a nature walk and/or a nature craft related to wetland animals.



Swamp Soiree

Swamps are not dark and creepy places! Join a nature instructor to learn the truth about wetlands. Forest walks, games, demonstrations, discussions and hands on activities will lead participants to a better understanding of the importance of wetlands.



Birdie Birthday

Wetlands are essential to the survival of many animals including more than 80% of endangered or threatened bird species! Join a nature instructor to learn about what makes birds unique and how birds have adapted to use wetlands as homes. Participants will learn to identify common wetland species by their calls and field marks and, weather permitting, enjoy a guided walk through the wetland where they can practice looking for signs of bird activity.
