

## It's Easy to File a Report Online

If you are reporting one of the following crimes, you may be able to file a police report online:

- Stolen Property
- Harassing Phone Call
- Damage to Property
- Lost Property
- Theft from Vehicle
- Damage to Vehicle

All you need is a valid email address. Simply go to [raleighnc.gov](http://raleighnc.gov), select **Police Department** then **Report a Crime**, and complete the following form:

After you submit a report, you will immediately receive a temporary report\*. Use this temporary report number to refer to your report until you receive an official report number (within 5 business days of reporting).

\* **NOTE:** Although the temporary report is printable, you cannot use it for insurance purposes.

## Other Raleigh Police Department Crime Reporting Options

If the crime you want to report is not one of the crimes you can report online, you have a number of reporting options.

### Call 911 to report an emergency such as:

- A crime that is in progress
- A crime that is about to happen
- Domestic violence
- Fire
- Injured person
- Life and death situations
- Medical emergencies
- Missing person
- Someone breaking into or entering your home or business
- Stolen vehicle
- Suspect who is still on scene
- Traffic accidents

### Call (919) 831-6311 to report non-emergency incidents in which:

- There is no serious personal injury, property damage or property loss
- There is no possibility that the suspect is still at the scene or likely to return to the scene
- An immediate response is not needed

# Benefits of Reporting a Crime Online

Our Online Crime Reporting system:

- Fill out an online incident report on your time schedule in an easy-to-use form.
- Allows you to enter one of six non-emergency crimes online. The only requirement is that you must have a valid email address.
- Receive an email of a temporary, printable report that you can use to communicate with the Crime Reporting Unit at the Raleigh Police Department until you receive the official report number.
- Receive an official report number within five business days if your report is accepted. The official report can be used to file an insurance claim or obtain a warrant.
- Speed up your reporting process and improve the accuracy of reports, enabling Crime Reporting Unit personnel to provide better service to the public.

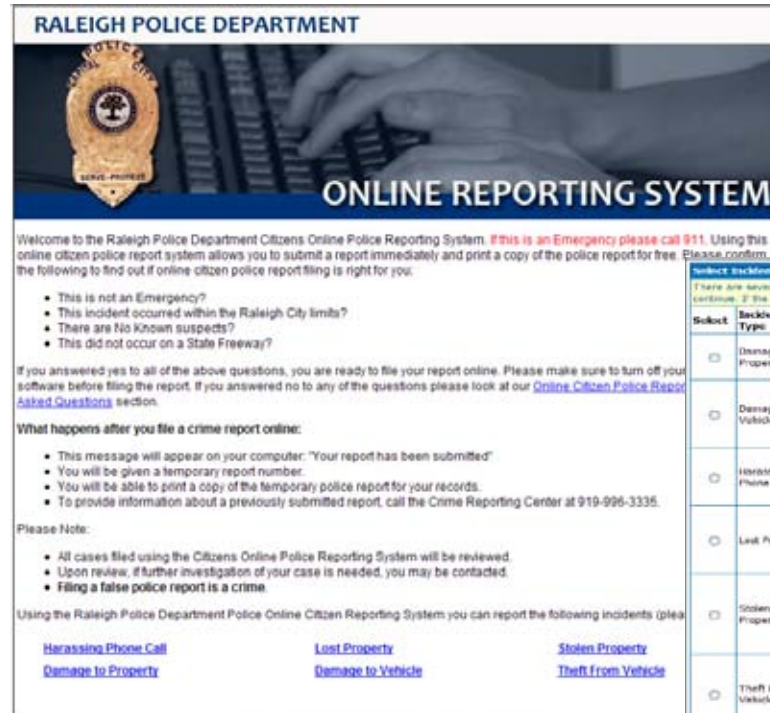
Please Note:

- All cases filed using the Citizens Online Police Reporting System will be reviewed.
- Upon review, if further investigation of your case is required, you may be contacted by a law enforcement official.
- Filing a false police report is a crime.



## WHERE TO FILE AN ONLINE CRIME REPORT

To report one of the six crimes, go to [raleighnc.gov](http://raleighnc.gov) and select **Police Department**, then select **Report a Crime**.

## CHOOSE PERSON OR BUSINESS

## SELECT A CRIME

When the Online Reporting System opens, select the crime you want to report from the following options:

- Damage to Property
- Damage to Vehicle
- Harassing Phone Call
- Lost Property
- Stolen Property
- Theft from Vehicle

Subject	Incident Type	Definition	Examples
<input type="checkbox"/>	Damage to Property	The act of intentionally damaging or destroying property that belongs to another person.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Graffiti (but not gang related graffiti)</li><li>• Throwing a rock through a window</li></ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	Damage to Vehicle	The act of intentionally damaging or destroying property that belongs to another person.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Graffiti (but not gang related graffiti)</li><li>• Keying your car</li><li>• Throwing a rock through a window</li><li>• Slashed tires, etc.</li></ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	Harassing Phone Call	Receipt of unwanted phone calls of an annoying or harassing nature.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Someone calls and immediately hangs up</li><li>• Someone calls and does not hang up in an effort to keep the line open</li></ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	Lost Property	When property is missing or lost.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Property that is missing</li><li>• Leaving items in restaurant</li><li>• Items missing from a home</li></ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	Stolen Property	The act of taking your property without your permission.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Does not include:<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Lost items</li><li>• Stolen license plates (tags)</li><li>• Stolen vehicles</li><li>• Stolen firearms</li></ul></li></ul>
<input type="checkbox"/>	Theft From Vehicle	The act of entering your vehicle and either stealing something or rummaging through your things even if nothing was stolen.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Someone breaks the vehicle window and stole your CD player.</li><li>• Someone entered your unlocked vehicle and rummaged through your glove box but did not take anything.</li></ul>

## START REPORT

Click the **Start Report** button to begin filling out the required information.

## SUBMIT REPORT

After you fill out the report, click **Submit Report**. You will receive a temporary report in about five minutes and an official report within five business days.
